About Ryan: After being around Dobermanns most of my childhood life with the involvement from my father, in 2010 I attended W&P of Wales to watch. Soon after in 2011 I was looking to purchase my first Dobermann, I then researched and settled on an Indonesian dog who was subsequently shown to champion status. I began my Judging career in 2013 judging an open show in Scotland. Since then I've judged various open shows and always been interested in the breed I've always loved. I'd like to thank Birmingham Dobermann Club for this opportunity to judge my first breed club show and I hope everyone has an enjoyable day.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 The Show will open at **10 a.m.**
- 2 Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3 Judging will commence at **10.30 a.m.**
- 4 Exhibits maybe removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5 The Entry Fees shall be: Non-Members £7.00 for the first entry with each dog and £3.00 for additional entries with the same dog. Members £4.50 for the first entry with each dog and £ 2.00 for additional entries with the same dog. Veteran Classes Members/Non-Members £2.50. Not For Competition ~ Members/Non-Members £2.00.
- 6 There is no prize money on offer at this Show.
- 7 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10 **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
- 11 **BEST IN SHOW.** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13 Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

- 14 All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15 All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor..
- 16 **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don't's travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

- 17 Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- 18 Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 19 No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible
- 20 The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of the dogs sent for exhibition, but it must be strictly understood by exhibitors and all persons that the Committee, Show Manager or their agents will not be responsible for the loss, detention of or damage to any dog or other property, whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants or others. The Committee will not be in any way responsible for any claim for injury or compensation by or arising out of the holding of this Show or by reason of any act or default of any persons in attendance thereat.
- 21 The Committee, Show Management or agents can accept no responsibility for the products on sale or sold by stand holders at this Show.
- 22 Should any cheque, money order, etc. not be honoured immediately upon presenting to the Bank, the entries will either be returned or the cheques etc. re-presented for discharge and any such costs or fees that are incurred, the exhibitor shall be held liable for the full amount of the fees and shall discharge this debt immediately upon request.
- 23 Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement, the Committee reserves to themselves the right of appointing other judges to fulfill their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded..
- 24 Exhibitors and their guests attending this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and Regulations, and it is on this understanding only that their entries are accepted. Any alterations to this rule may only be considered binding if it is expressly authorised by the Show Management or by the Kennel Club.
- 25 Committee Members are ineligible to exhibit dogs in the ring at this Show.
- 26 The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
- 27 Should any question arise, not provided for by these Regulations or by the Kennel Club Rules, the decision of the Committee shall be final, subject only to appeal to the Kennel Club.
- 28 **CANCELLATION OR ABANDONMENT:** It is at the discretion of the Committee whether Entry fees will be refunded in circumstances where any Act of God or any other unforeseen reason causes the cancellation or abandonment of the show after postal entries have closed.
- 29 **Best Veteran in Show:** Best Veteran in Show will be selected from all unbeaten veterans from any breed classes provided they are not beaten by any other veteran.

- 30 Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided
- 31 The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
- 32 An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration or addition made by the Committee to the schedule or in these Rules shall be sufficient notice thereof.
- 33 All children must be kept under control and parents will be held responsible for any damage caused and charges incurred.
- 34 Please do not obstruct gangways with trolleys. Storage space will be made available for trolleys/ cages.
- 35 If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
- 36 A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of the appropriate entry fees.
- 37 Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO RIGHTS The Organisers would like to bring the regulation on photography and filming to the attention of exhibitors, trade stands, press and visitors. It is a condition of all those attending the event that no filming or other form of recording may be taken or made at the venue without express written permission of the Organisers. The taking of photographs in the show venue for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Organisers. Press accredited photographers are provided with permission to take photographs ONLY for use in newspapers, magazines and internet sites – this is for news purposes only. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs of general views of the Show, provided that these are for private use. Specific dogs may be photographed only with the approval of the exhibitor. No photography or filming is permitted in breed judging rings whilst judging is actually taking place. However, judges may allow it to happen at the end of classes or after the Challenge Certificate is awarded. Filming and flash photography is allowed from outside the ring at all times unless the operation of the camera is actually affecting exhibits. However, if a powerful flash unit is used or it is clear that exhibits are being affected, a ring steward or the judge is empowered to stop the person concerned.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count towards the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **FRIDAY 5th APRIL 2019**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) **WITHDRAWAL.**

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20

(2) **TRANSFER.**

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or the Junior class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no Puppy or Junior class, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more first prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not)

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more first prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more first prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

RULES & REGULATIONS ~ OBEDIENCE CLASSES

The rules listed below are in addition to the previous Rules and Regulations and are specific to Obedience Classes. These Rules and Regulations are to be read in conjunction with the Kennel Club Obedience Show Regulations G under which this show is licensed. It is the responsibility of everyone entering this show to make themselves familiar with the Kennel Club G Regulations, available from the Kennel Club.

- 1 Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Obedience Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
- 2 Entry is limited to Dobermanns.
- 3 Dogs which have won an Obedience Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Obedience Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club are not eligible for entry at this Show.
- 4 In classes without a full running order dogs will be received until one hour after the commencement of judging: approx. 12pm after which no dogs may be received except under unforeseen and exceptional circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
- 5 Animals allowed in Event. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under control at all times.
- 6 For the duration of the show all dogs, including those in the exercise area, must be on a lead except when competing or practicing prior to competition.
- 7 Following discussion between the Chief Steward and the show management, a dog shall be removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a) A bitch which is in season.
 - b) Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of any opponent.
 - d) Of such temperament as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- 8 Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
- 9 No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- 10 No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
- 11 Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- 12 Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 13 All competitors must personally report to the ringside of all classes entered and book in, by making a list of entries, within one hour of the scheduled time for commencement of judging of their class. Competitors reporting late will be excluded from competition unless they have previously reported to the Chief Steward that they are actually working a dog in the stay test of another class.

**** NEW CLASSIFICATION** Special Introductory Class:** This class is to introduce and support newcomers to Obedience Competition. In this class only incentives in the form of a toy or rewards are allowed to be carried by the handler in the competitive ring and may be given to the dog at the end of an exercise or in between exercises. Rewards include food which must be carried in a small closed container during the exercises. The judge will designate an area in the competitive ring where food may be given to the dog by the handler.

In the Special Introductory, Special Pre-Beginners, Special Beginners and Special Novice Classes handlers will not be penalised for encouragement or extra commands except in the Sit and Down tests. In these tests, at the discretion of the Judge, handlers may face their dogs. Judges or stewards must not use the words "last command" except in the Sit and Down tests. In Special Class 'A' handlers will be allowed a simultaneous command and signal. All other commands and signals must be penalised.

ELIGIBILITY & DEFINITION OF CLASSES FOR OBEDIENCE

- 1 In the following definitions of classes, first prize wins in Limited show obedience classes & open shows confined to one breed do not count for entry in Open, Premier or Championship show obedience classes but do count for eligibility at Limited obedience shows or open shows confined to one breed.
- 2 Dogs are ineligible to compete at Limited Shows which have won an Obedience Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Obedience Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Obedience Champions are only eligible to compete in Class C at Open and Championship Shows.
- 3 A dog must be entered in the lowest scheduled class for which it is eligible and may also be entered in another class if desired plus one additional class at the society's discretion. Additional classes may be entered.
- 4 In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. **FRIDAY 5th APRIL 2019**

SPECIAL INTRODUCTORY	For Dogs that have never won a first prize in any obedience class.
SPECIAL PRE-BEGINNERS	For Dogs that have not won more than 3 first prizes in any obedience classes.
SPECIAL BEGINNERS	For Dogs that have not won more than 4 first prizes in Special Beginners or Special Novice or a first prize in Special Class 'A'
SPECIAL NOVICE	For Dogs that have not won more than 6 first prizes in Special Novice or 3 first prizes in Special Class 'A'
SPECIAL CLASS 'A'	Open to all dogs.

The detailed tests in each of the scheduled Classes will be:-

SPECIAL INTRODUCTORY – Total points available 40

- 1 Play with the dog for 15-30 seconds, on or off lead. Handlers may use a silent toy - 10 pts.
- 2 Heel on lead - 10 pts.
- 3 Recall with a finish on lead, off lead or long line at the handler's choice - 10 pts.
- 4 One minute stay on lead in either the sit or down at handler's choice - 10 pts.

SPECIAL PRE-BEGINNERS Total points available 75

- 1 Heel on Lead - 15 pts.
- 2 Heel Free - 20 pts.
- 3 Recall from sit or down position at handler's choice. Dog to be recalled by handler when stationary and facing the dog. Dog to return smartly to the handler, sit in front & finish - all on command of Judge or Steward to handler. Distance at discretion of Judge. Test commences when handler leaves dog - 10 pts.
- 4 Sit Stay one minute, handler in sight - 10 pts.
- 5 Down Stay two minutes, handler in sight - 20 pts.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS Total points available 100

- 1 Heel on Lead - 15 pts.
- 2 Heel Free - 20 pts.
- 3 Recall (as in Special Pre-Beginners above) - 10 pts.
- 4 Retrieve any article. Handlers will use their own article - 25 pts.
- 5 Sit Stay one minute, handler in sight - 10 pts.
- 6 Down Stay two minutes, handler in sight - 20 pts.

SPECIAL NOVICE Total points available 100

- 1 Heel on Lead - 20 pts.
- 2 Heel Free - 25 pts.
- 3 Recall (as in Special Pre-Beginners and Special Beginners above) - 10 pts.
- 4 Retrieve a dumbbell, handlers will use their own dumbbell - 15 pts.
- 5 Sit Stay one minute, handler in sight, backs to dogs - 10 pts.
- 6 Down Stay two minutes, handler in sight, backs to dogs - 20 pts.

SPECIAL CLASS 'A' Total points available 175

- 1 Heel on Lead at Normal, Slow and Fast pace; each pace change from the halt position - 20pts
- 2 Heel Free at Normal and Slow pace; each change of pace from the halt position - 40pts
- 3 Retrieve a dumbbell, handlers will use their own dumbbell - 15pts.
- 4 Class A Recall - 20pts
- 6 Scent discrimination; handler's scent on cloth provided by the Judge. The cloth will be placed amongst 5 other neutral cloths and will form a straight line going away from the handler. Cloths to be a minimum of 3 feet and not exceeding 5 feet apart - 30pts
- 7 Sit Stay - two minutes, handler in sight - 20pts
- 8 Down Stay - three minutes, handler out of sight - 30pts
