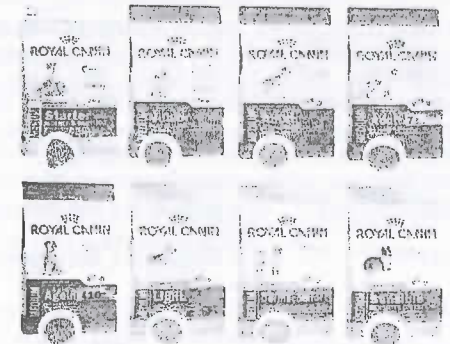

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a C.C. includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rule of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which counts towards the title of Champion shall be Five Point Green Stars or more.

Wins at Championship Shows at Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members classes or competing for Members specials each partner must, at the time of entry, be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to & including the 7th day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e 20/05/19. Wins in variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering variety classes, wins in both breed and variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a special prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

1. WITHDRAWAL: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 9(j) & 20.

2. TRANSFER:

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight, or height & in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any other reason than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which it is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of 6 & not exceeding 9 calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of 6 & not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of 6 & not exceeding 18 calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won three or more First prizes at any shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy, Special Puppy classes excepted) whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won 5 or more first prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become Show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more first prizes in lall at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided & eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may, at their discretion accept NFC entries. These entries need not be from breeds of dogs included within the title of the societies.

Directions: Leave A1M motorway at junction 61 (Bowburn). Travel into Bowburn and hall is 500 yards on right. Parking at front and rear of hall.

RULES & REGULATIONS.

1. OPENING OF THE SHOW. The Show will open at 10-30 am
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 11am
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Management and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club.
5. ENTRY FEES: £4 first entry per dog, 50p for each subsequent entries with the same dog.
Not for Competition £4 per dog. Membership: £6 Joint, £4 Single
6. There is no prize money on offer at this Show.
7. The Committee reserve to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under 6 calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10 BEST PUPPY IN SHOW : (a) Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a Puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a Puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog, it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
- 11 BEST IN SHOW Best in Show must be selected from the Exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13 Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes the feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14 All exhibitors must be familiar with KC Reg F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor
- 16 DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS: Anyone whose dogs entered at a Kennel Club Licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts traveling to and whilst at KC licensed events. When traveling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy route & leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. Your vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle. Keep the dog in the shade. Take your own shade, eg., large umbrella and always have plenty of water available so your dog stays well hydrated. Avoid taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended periods of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter & dehydrated & this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dogs welfare.
WARNING: If your dog is at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
- 17 Anyone who is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should not put a dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations, in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.
- 18 Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered.
- 19 No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 20 Any Owner, Competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove, as soon as possible, any fouling caused by their dogs at any Kennel Club licensed Show within the licensed venue and within their environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
- 21 Entries must be made on or before closing date shown on front cover.

- 23 Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement, the committee reserve the right of appointing a substitute.
- 24 All dogs must be registered with or transferred at the Kennel Club before the show.
- 25 The Show will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
- 26 The entrance fee of a dog entered but not brought to the show will be forfeited.
- 27 All monies due to the club which remain unpaid, either entry fees or bank charges accrued through dishonoured cheques, will be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 28 Car parking is free but the society accepts no responsibility for any damage caused.
- 29 All gangways must be kept clear.
- 30 All cages, crates and boxes must be identified and this identification must be on prominent display. This is the responsibility of the exhibitor.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee whose decision shall be final & may include reference for disciplinary action under K.C. Rule A 42.
2. a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
(a) operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
(b) the removal of dewclaws of any breed:
(c) operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
5. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
