RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.00am.

2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.

3. Judging will commence at 10.00am in both rings.

4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.

5. Entry fees: Pembrokes with CC's- Members £10.00, Non-members £11.00

Subsequent entries per dog, per class: Free

Cardigans with CC's - Members £10.00, Non-members £11.00

Subsequent entries per dog, per class: Free

Special Award Classes £2.00

Catalogue £3.00 with entries,

Membership fees: Single @ £1.50, Family/Partnership's @ £2.00,

Our membership year runs from January through December.

Not For Competition - Well behaved NFC dogs accepted at no charge, but please put on entry form. Unexpected NFC's on the day to report to the Secretary.

6. Prize Money: £50 Best in Show, £25 each for Reserve Best in show, Best Post Graduate and Best Veteran

7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.

8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.

9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

10. Best Puppy in Show

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy) A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively.

11. Best in Show

The dog declared Best in Show must be selected from Best in Breed, (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified). Reserve Best in Show must be

selected from the remaining Best of Breed(s) and the dog/bitch declared by the breed judge to be Reserve Best of Breed to the dog declared Best in Show.

12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

14 All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

16. DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

See Annex A

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.

18. Not for Competition:

Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered. The Secretary can also issue Not For Competition passes on the day of the Show.

19. Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement, the Committee reserves to itself the right to appoint a substitute.

20. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.

21. Passes will not be sent out. Acknowledgement of entries will be posted on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope/postcard.

22. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Any failing to clear up will be reported to the Committee who may enforce the right to refuse entries from that exhibitor for future shows.

23. The owner, exhibitor or handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks

and approaches.

24. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been

a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to Judges appointed as an emergency.

b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.

25. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

Annex A DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS Show Schedule Notice

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Use of Electrical Equipment at Shows

The Kennel Club is becoming increasingly concerned at the amount of electrical equipment being used by exhibitors at shows, including hair dryers and hair straighteners and other grooming devices.

Electrical equipment should not be brought to shows unless absolutely necessary. In rare instances where it might be required, it should be PAT tested and permission sought from the secretary of the show before it is used.

The Kennel Club has also been informed of recent instances of exhibitors commandeering certain areas of a venue in order to have access to power points so as to use electrical grooming equipment. This is totally unacceptable and particularly unfair on the breeds whose allocated areas have been cramped because of this selfish behaviour.

Security at shows

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all Societies of the importance of security at dog shows.

The Kennel Club understands that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert.

Furthermore the society should provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and of the evacuation procedures in place.

Annex B Advisory Notes – Additional Rules and Regulations

- i. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves to themselves the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
- ii. Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
- iii. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
- iv. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration or addition made by the Committee to the schedule or in these Rules shall be sufficient notice thereof.
- v. All children must be kept under control and parents will be held responsible for any damage caused and charges incurred.
- vi. Please do not obstruct gangways with **cages, pens, grooming tables, trolleys and dogs**. Storage space will be made available for trolleys/cages.
- vii. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances.
- viii. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
- ix. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event)
- x. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of the appropriate entry fees.

- xi. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 21 October 2019.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety Classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F.(1).19

(2) Transfer

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it

to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY	For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
PUPPY	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
JUNIOR	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
YEARLING	For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the show.
NOVICE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or Three or more First Prizes at Open and Cha/ CACIB/CAC/Green Star championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
GRADUATE	For dogs that have not won a Challenge Certificate /CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
POST GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate /CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
LIMIT	For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in <i>Limit or Open</i> Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
OPEN	For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
VETERAN	For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES

FAQs on Special Award Classes

Introduction In response to the growing number of Breed Clubs wishing to hold Special Award Classes at their show, the following FAQs have been provided.

Q. What shows can hold SACs?

A. These classes can be held at breed club Limited, Open or Championship shows, with the exception that Special Award Champion Classes cannot be held at Limited shows. It is advisable to inform the main judge that these classes are taking place.

Q. What is a Special Award Class?

A. In the broadest sense Special Award Classes (SAC) are a form of "mock class" which can be scheduled at a show for the purpose of allowing a B or C list judge the opportunity to gain more hands on experience. SAC are separate from the main judging and usually take place during the lunch break of a show.

Q. Do we need to request permission to schedule the SAC?

A. Yes please write to the Kennel Club on Club headed paper specifying the show date.

Q. How many Special Award Classes can be offered at a show?

A. No more than three classes per sex may be scheduled at any show. However, three classes per sex may **only** be scheduled at those Shows where the dogs and bitches are judged in separate rings and they must be judged by two separate judges. It is important that the classes be judged during the lunch break and that they do not detract from the smooth running of the main show.

Q. Should the SAC be included in the schedule and entry form?

A. Yes, SAC should be included in the schedule and on the entry form. Clubs may also find it helpful to outline that classes are being scheduled in order to boost the judges' hands on experience and hopefully attract a high entry.

Q. Do we need to define the special award classes in the schedule?

A. Yes, all classes should be clearly defined.

Q. Is there a format for how these awards should appear in the schedule?

A. There is no set format but the classes must not be numbered so as not to be confused with the main show and it should be made clear that being beaten in these classes does not affect a dog's eligibility to challenge for best dog/bitch.

Q. Can an entry fee be charged?

A. This is at the discretion of the show society however it is important to remember that the objective of the classes is to provide experience for novice judges and it is not solely to generate additional revenue.2

Q. When should the awards be scheduled?

A. Within reason they may be scheduled at anytime. However, the preferred time is during the lunch break, as it creates a spectacle for the exhibitors, often attracts a larger entry/audience and does not detract from the main judging.

Q. Should Rosettes and Prize cards be offered?

A. Yes, in accordance with Regulation F(1).7 there should be at least 4 awards including Reserve on offer in every class. Printed award cards must be given and these may indicate the name of the Society, the type and date of the Show, the nature of the award and the name of any commercial firms donating the awards.

Q. Can prize money be offered?

A. This is at the discretion of the show society.

Q. Must dogs be entered for competition in the show to take part?

A. Yes, only those dogs which have been entered into the main show are eligible for entry into the SAC (with the exception of dogs competing in the Special Award Champions Class).

Q. Can the judge appointed for the special award class(es) exhibit at the show?

A. No, in line with Regulation F(1)21.e judges may not exhibit for competition or handle a dog in the ring at a show at which they are officiating.

Q. If the person appointed to judge has handled a dog at a show, boarded or prepared for exhibition within the previous twelve months can the dog be entered in the SAC?

A. No - Regulation F(1)30.a.(11) refers.

Q. Does the beaten dog rule count?

A. No. These are separate classes to the main competition and therefore a dog beaten in competition for SAC is not considered a beaten dog.

Q. Can the judge of the SAC select a 'Best Dog/Bitch' from the classes?

A. No, this is a ring fenced class designed to give aspiring judges the opportunity to gain more hands on experience; they are not a competition in themselves.

Q. Can Breed Clubs schedule a Special Award Champions Class at their show? A.

Yes, at Breed Club Championship & Open shows the Special Award Champions class may be scheduled with the proviso that a B or C list judge be appointed and the class is scheduled outside the main competition.

N.B. Champions classes are not to be held at Limited shows.

KENNEL CLUB REGULATION F (ANNEX B)

Regulation for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and / or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and / or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.

(a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.

(b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he / she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under rule A 42.

2(a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show

b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3. No act or operation which alters the natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed, except:

a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.

b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.

c) Operations to prevent breeding providing that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Please note - the Show opens at 9:00 am. The doors will not be opened to exhibitors before this time!
