(Spotlight on the Judges)

DOG JUDGE: LESLEY McFADYEN (ARAI DH)

My introduction to the breed was via “pepper”, our first SBT. She leapt into my life in 1976 when our vet told us they were a Great breed for a growing family and she quickly taught me so much. Typical of her breeding (She came from Larujon and Rapparee lines) she was strong and Fiery! Never Shown, Pepper lived to 13 and reared a litter of Puppies from a Constones/Beaconmoor bred sire with incredible ease. In the mid 80’s I bought two bitches with a background of Ashstock breeding and got involved in the show ring, having very moderate success at first. I joined the committee of the EASBTC in 1988 and have served ever since, having been show manager for a number of years and secretary now since 2000, a role I am extremely proud of. Having bought in a bitch from Rob Drummond (Sparstaff) I was fortunate to have bred some beautiful pups, the ones probably most known being CH Araidh Dot To Dot, CH Araidh Devil May Care, CH Araidh Ladies Wot Lunch at Rotherstaff, all sired by the wonderful Jack, Knockin The Divil Himself at Kilvara, and also the fabulous Tammy Clewley, Araidh Sweetest Taboo. Three of my precious pups have travelled across the world and Araidh Tea Leaf became an Australian Champion and gained agility titles, with Araidh Atlantic Starr becoming a Canadian Champion and also excelling, along with his niece, Araidh Secret Lover, at agility and representing Canada at the European Agility Championships. I Co-ordinate our Clubs SBT Display Team and am so proud of the positive work they do for the breed appearing not only at Crufts and Discover Dogs but also at varied events around the country, including the prestigious BBC Countryfile Live for the last three years. I first judged SBT’s in 1993 and awarded my first set of C.C’s Nine years later. I have been fortunate to have judge in Australia, NZ, South Africa, France, Spain, Holland and Sweden as well as throughout the UK and the Republic of Ireland. It’s a good few years since I have judged in Wales, so I am really looking forward to it and am always grateful to exhibitors for affording me the opportunity

BITCH JUDGE: MELANIE CORCORAN (MOLRU)

I acquired my first Stafford in 2001 having been around them my whole life. My aunt and uncle bred and showed with some success which started before I was born back in the 70’s, I was always eager to pay them a visit to get my hands on their dogs and that’s where the passion ignited. “Molly” didn’t turn out as the Show dog that I had hoped for so along came “Ruby” who became my First Champion CH/INT CH Bad Girl Pauline at Molru. “Ruby” was all I had hoped for and quickly got made up along with 2 RCC’s & numerous years as Top Stafford in Ireland. Again my dreams came true and “Ruby” produced my first home bred Champion’s Molru Cosmic Love along with her sister CH Molru I Gotta Feeling. “Rory” CH/GB CH/INT CH Zakstaff What’s The Story at Molru arrived at the same time as the girls and took Ireland by storm becoming the Breed Record Holder in Ireland along with winning the DCC twice at Crufts!. Once with BOB & G3 Placing. I have made up 2 New Irish Champions CH Molru Because I’m Worth It & CH Molru Alright Dave with “Dave” also gaining his title in the UK. Along with another dog I bred CH Molru Nothing Else Matters also gaining his Title in the UK. I am currently campaigning my young dog Molru Navigator, In 2017 I was also awarded Top UK Breeder.....

This was the first time this accolade has been won by anyone outside the UK, which was a very proud moment for me. I have judged in Ireland, UK, USA, Czech Republic, Italy, Australia & Finland. It is a he honour to be invited to Award C.C’s at The Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club Of South Wales

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE

Please ensure that your dog is entered in its correct class as regards to *Sex, Age, and Eligibility* for the class where the number of wins count when entering. When posting your entry please obtain a free **CERTIFICATE OF POSTING** at the Post Office to ensure your entry will prove acceptable to the Kennel Club should your entry go astray. Please ensure that your cheque is available for immediate encashment. Those which are not so for whatever reason (including technical irregularities) will not be accepted, and entries will be returned. There will be a charge of £10 made to the exhibitor for any cheque not honoured plus the entry fee.

All new Membership applications for the S.B.T.C.S.W. must be accompanied with a membership form.

PLEASE NOTE: Strict fines will be imposed on the spot for any mess not cleaned up. It is a strict condition that on no account will any mess be tolerated.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Member's classes or competing for Member's Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class

i.e. 4th **NOVEMBER 2019**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options :-

- (1) *Withdrawal* – The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F.(1).19 and 20.
- (2) *Transfer* –
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively of the correct colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed..

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.30 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.15 a.m. in both rings.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or the Show Management and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club.
5. **FEES:** Members: £13.00 first entry per dog.
£1.00 all subsequent entries with same dog.
Non-Members: £15.00 first entry per dog.
£1.00 all subsequent entries with same dog.
Veteran Classes: FREE per dog.
Not for Competition: £1.50 per dog.
Catalogues: £2.00 pre-paid with entry (£3.00 on the day).
(Please note: Any catalogues unclaimed by 12.30 p.m. will be sold)
Membership: Single or Joint £5.00 (Covers 2020)
6. There is no Prize Money on offer at this Show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show
11. **BEST IN SHOW:** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex w. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) – Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS:** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

© When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

☺ If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

☺ The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

☺ Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

☺ When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

☺ Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

☺ Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
21. The Committee does not hold itself responsible for the loss or damage to persons, dogs or property.
22. Should any of the Judges be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition, but no entry fees can be refunded.
23. Information from entry forms will be stored on computer and the name, address and details of entries may be published in the Catalogue, unless otherwise advised; information about results may also be published and/or provided to the press for publication. Information about exhibitors may also be passed to any regulatory authority or Trading Standards. The making of an entry is irrevocable consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.

Directions

Travelling from the East:

Leave the M4 at Junction 25a and Merge onto the A4042.
After ¼ mile at the Roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A4042
After 1 1/2 mile at the Roundabout take the 1st exit and stay on the A4042
After ¼ mile at the Roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A4051
After 1 mile at the Roundabout take the 2nd exit and stay on the A4051
After ½ mile at the Roundabout take the 1st exit onto Henllys Way.
Then immediately you will be on another roundabout; take the 3rd exit onto Henllys Way and the Venue is on your right hand side.

Travelling from the West:

Leave the M4 at junction 26, then at roundabout take the 1st exit onto the A4051
After 1 mile, At roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A4051
After ½ mile, At roundabout take the 1st exit onto Henllys Way.
Immediately you're on another roundabout, take the 3rd exit onto Henllys Way, and the Venue is on your right hand side.

The Venue is approx 15 miles from the Severn Bridge.
