

Directions to the Venue. (By courtesy of Andrew Morris)

Leave the M5 at junction 6 and take the A449 towards Kidderminster then take the turning on your left A4536 towards Blackpole.

At the junction turn right towards Fernal Heath then at the end of the road by the White Hart turn left onto the A38. After about a mile you will come to a roundabout, turn left and you will see the Leisure Centre signposted.

If coming from the Malvern or Hereford direction it is easier to go through the city (unless flooded) Once over the bridge head towards Droitwich/Bromsgrove on the A38. When the road divides between Bromsgrove and Kidderminster take the right fork towards Bromsgrove. At the island turn right and you will see the Leisure Centre signposted.

The Officers and Committee members of the society holding the licence are deemed responsible for organising and conducting the show safely and in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Kennel Club and agree to abide by and adopt any decision of the Board or any authority to whom the Board may delegate its powers subject to the conditions of Regulation F17 In so doing those appointed as officers and committee members accept that they are jointly and severally responsible for the organisation of the show and that this is a binding undertaking (vide Kennel Club General Show Regulations F4 and F5).

The Society will ensure to the best of its ability that the event is run to Covid Safe Guidelines. It is your responsibility to comply with national and local restrictions including advice given about non-essential travel in and out of locally affected regions (which must not be ignored) - in the interests of the safety of all participants this may give rise to a short notice of refusal of entry at the society's discretion. If a competitor or anyone in their household has Covid 19 related symptoms or has tested positive for Covid 19 they must isolate in line with government advice.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at **8.30 am**.
2. Dogs will be received at any time, but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for Judging when required.
3. Judging will commence in ring 1 with Pembroke Dogs at **9.30 am**. Cardigans will be judged in ring 2 at **11.00am**.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show, after their judging has been completed. The show will close half-an-hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. **ENTRY FEES:**

PEMBROKES MEMBERS, £14.00 First entry per dog,
Subsequent entries with the same dog free.

PEMBROKES NON-MEMBERS, £15.00 First entry per dog,
£2.00 for subsequent entries with the same dog.

CARDIGANS MEMBERS £14.00 First entry per dog,
Subsequent entries with the same dog free.

CARDIGANS NON-MEMBERS £15 00 First entry per dog
£2.00 for subsequent entries with the same dog

NFC Free

MEMBERSHIP FEES: £ 2.00 Single,
£ 3.00 Joint (2 partners or members of the same household),
Additional partners or members of the same household **£1.00**

CATALOGUES: £3.50 each, paid with entries.
£4.00 each, on the day.

7. There is no prize money on offer at this show.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The Mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden
11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy In Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve Calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best in Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Withdrawal from other Competition. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy In Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy In Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
PROVISO. For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. **BEST IN SHOW.** The dog declared Best In Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same show. Best In Show must be selected from all unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Best of Breed(s) and the dog/bitch declared by the judge to be Reserve Best of Breed to the dog declared Best In Show. Withdrawal From Other Competition
Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however must not compete in any subsequent competition.
PROVISO. For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best In Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS
FOR EXHIBITION, F1(B).**

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition at a show. When a dog is found to have been prepared for exhibition at a show in contravention of these regulations the exhibitor will be dealt with as if a complaint under Kennel Club Rule 42 had been lodged against them and proved to the satisfaction of the General Committee without prejudice to the right of the exhibitor to make representations to the General Committee in mitigation of the penalty to be imposed at the discretion of the General Committee under Rule 42. The dog will be automatically disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
2. No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition either before or at the show. Any other substance, other than water, which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat of a dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog, or any part thereof may be performed and nothing may be done, calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive, except:-
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
4. The General committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog, or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner, or handler, of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by any official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the ground for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for the objection made on their behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Kennel Club Advice on Dogs in Cars on Hot Days

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog/s are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club regulations in this respect may be referred to the general Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club rules and regulations,

Right To Refuse Entries Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under KC Regulations to refuse any entry.

14. Exhibitors must not pick up their dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Regulation F11
15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in such a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
16. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
17. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
18. **Dogs in Cars on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers guidance to help guide you through the do's and don't's traveling to and whilst at KC licensed events. These Guidelines are printed on page 6 of this schedule.
19. **All entries must be made on or before Saturday 6th November 2021 (Postmark) or online by Monday 8th November 2021.**
20. Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement, the committee reserve to themselves the right to appoint another judge, subject to Kennel Club approval, to fulfill the duty, in which case exhibitors may withdraw their dogs from competition, but entry fees will not be refunded.
21. The Committee will not be responsible for the entire, or partial loss, or detention of, or damage to a dog/s whatsoever, nor of any act or omission of themselves, or their agents, or officers, or others, and it is on this understanding only, that entries are accepted.
22. Exhibitors showing dogs are not permitted to hold conversation with the judge during competition and any exhibitor who persists in addressing the judge after being asked not to do so by the ring steward the judge or Committee will be reported to the Kennel Club. No persons other than exhibitors, (officials excepted) will be allowed in the ring during the judging of classes or special awards.
23. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered. NB Dogs must be over 4 months of age.
24. No modifications will be made to this schedule except with permission of the General Committee of The Kennel Club which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES.

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show Award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Show Awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count towards the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members Specials, each partner must, at the time of entry, be a member of this Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up-to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class. (i.e. Saturday 30th October 2021. Wins in variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes, but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If any exhibitor reports before the judging of a class, or classes, that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) **WITHDRAWAL**, 'The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) **TRANSFER**,

(a) If a dog is ineligible for a class, or classes, as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class, or Junior Class which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class respectively to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(c) For any other reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY, for dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

PUPPY, for dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age

JUNIOR, for dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show

MAIDEN, for dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or a first prize at an Open or Championship Show, (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted whether restricted or not).

NOVICE, for dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows, (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four—calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

GRADUATE, f or dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate /CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE, for dogs which have not a Challenge Certificate /CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not.

LIMIT, for dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognized by the Kennel Club or won three or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN, for all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS. Neither dog, owner or handler to have won a Challenge Certificate or Reserve Challenge Certificate.

GOOD CITIZEN. For dogs that have achieved their GCDS Bronze award Certificate or above.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the show.
