Jurisdiction and responsibilities

In so doing those appointed as officers and committee members accept that they are jointly and severally responsible for the organisation of the show and that this is a binding undertaking (vide Kennel Club General Show Regulations F4 and F5).

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognized by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class ie:

19.8.2022

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A First prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

Withdrawal –The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

Transfer-a) if a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class(es) for its correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy, Puppy or Junior class which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct, colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY-For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 9 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY-For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR-For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING-For dogs of 12 and not exceeding 24 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE-For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate, CACIB/CAC/ Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open & Championship shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted

or not).

GRADUATE-For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate, CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE-For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate, CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MID LIMIT-For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognized by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Star or won 5 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT-For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognized by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/ Green Star or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN-For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS-For dogs shown by an exhibitor who has never won a Challenge Certificate in the breed.

NOTE: It is the exhibitor who has to qualify, not the dog.

VETERAN-For dogs not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

NOT FOR COMPETITION-Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show opens at 9.30am
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that the exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00am
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after judging has been completed.
5. ENTRY FEES: Non-Members: First Entry £13.00 per dog, subsequent entries with the same dog £1.50.
Members: First Entry £11.00 per dog, subsequent entries with the same dog £1.50, NFC £2 per dog. Membership Fees: Single £3, Joint, £4, Junior £1. On line entries www.onlineshowentry.com
6. Prize Money will be awarded to B.I.S £25, R.B.I.S. £10, B.P.I.S. £15, R.B.P.I.S £10, B.V.I.S. £15
7. The Committee reserves the right to itself to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. BEST PUPPY IN SHOW - Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show. Where, the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
11. BEST IN SHOW - Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the

following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts of travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or for standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations. The use of pinch collars, shock collars or prong collars is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the Show.

18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered or on the Agility Register.

19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by an advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

20. BEST VETERAN IN SHOW. Any exhibit over the age of 7 and unbeaten by any other veteran at the Show.

21. The Committee reserves the right to alter the order of judging to ensure the smooth running of the Show.

22. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed shows within the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.

23. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst

- at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
24. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved among other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency. b) exhibited without payment of appropriate fees
25. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited its handler shall display the correct ring number.
26. The Committee does not hold itself responsible for the loss or damage to persons, dogs, or property.
27. Should any of the judges be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition, but no entry fees can be refunded.
28. No animal, other than an exhibit duly entered at the Show, will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its continuance.
29. Information from entry forms will be stored on computer and the name, address and details of entries may be published in the Catalogue, unless otherwise advised; information about results may also be published and/or provided to the press for publication. Information about exhibitors may also be passed to any regulatory authority or Trading Standards. The making of an entry is irrevocable consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.

PLEASE NOTE

It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to provide crate identification and should note that original exhibit number cards must NOT be used for this purpose.

F(Annex B)

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11.
 - a) A dog found to be exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the Show and from any award gained thereat.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.

2.
 - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

7.
 - a) Allowing dogs to be entered into Variety Classes without having been entered or competed in a breed class.
 - b) To allow dogs declared Best of Breed or Best A.V.N.S.C. that have been beaten in a variety class to continue to challenge for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show and Best in Group & Best in Show respectively.

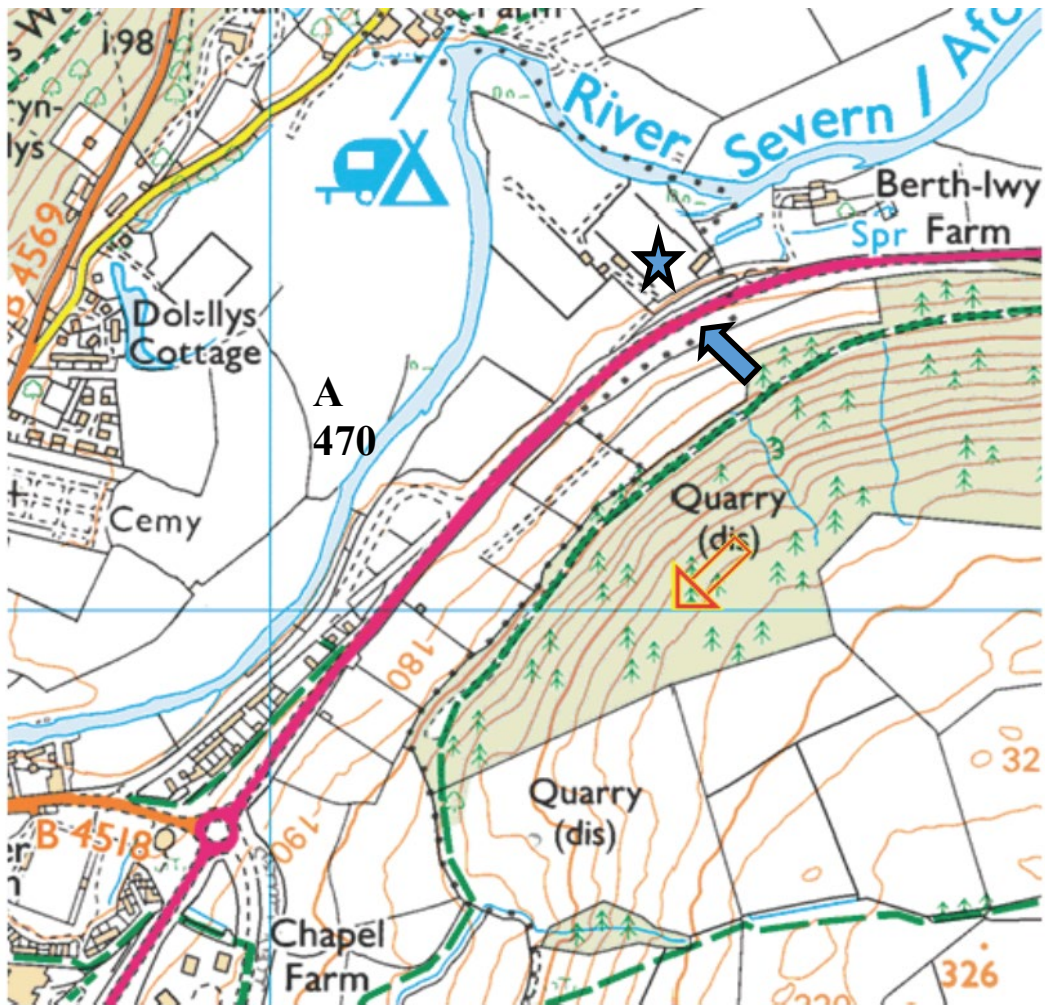
