

14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their $\operatorname{dog}(\mathrm{s})$ are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Soard for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their $\operatorname{dog}(\mathrm{s})$ are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under The Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show. 18. Not for Competition: Not for Competition entries not accepted.
19. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
20. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or or disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11.
a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will
automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any ward gained thereat
(b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any
external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any
part thereof may be performed except:-
(a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the Board.
(b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
(c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the Board to deceive.
4. The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by
the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

## RULES \& REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 8:00am
2. Dogs received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure they are available for judging when required. 3. Judging will commence at 9:00am.

4 Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all udging has been completed.
5. Entry Fees: $£ 6.00$ per dog per first entry; Subsequent entry $£ 1.50$, except; Stakes Classes $£ 3.50$ per entry; Handling lasses $£ 1.00$ per class; Catalogues $£ 3.00$ ordered with entries (None on the day) to claim you will need a voucher: Advertisements in catalogue $£ 8.00$ Full page and $£ 5.00$ Half page: Car Parking is FREE, Rosette donations. $£ 2.00$ for Special and $£ 3.50$ for Class 1st to 4th (The Committee reserves the right to transfer Rosette donations to another class if already atered for by prior donation)
6. Prize Money: BIS $£ 20$; Res BIS $£ 15$; Best Puppy I.S. $£ 15$; Best Veteran $£ 10$, Best in Group $£ 10$; Best Puppy in Group $£ 5$. Puppy Stakes $1^{\text {st }}-£ 80, \quad 2^{\text {nd }}-£ 30, \quad 3^{\text {rd }}-£ 20, \quad 4^{\text {th }}-£ 15, \quad 5^{\text {th }}-£ 10, \quad 6^{\text {th }}-£ 5$

7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. Best Puppy in Show
here a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best in Group or Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best in Group and Best in Show respectively.
Best Puppy in Group and subsequent Group placings must be selected from:
a) Those puppies declared Best Puppy in Breed.
b)

The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group. The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each group. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group winners.
11. Best in Show. The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register
Shows Judged on the Group System
(Definition; Shows judged on the Group System includes classes for breeds within more than one group, as defined in Kenne Club Regulation $\mathrm{B}(\mathrm{A})$; and require a judge to declare a best of each group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show.)

Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.

## Best of Group

Best of group and subsequent placings must be selected from:
he Best of Breed winners in each group
The Best dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.
The Best dog from Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each Group or on each day. Best in Show
Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.
2. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not eing completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management
3. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

## DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club.
Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.
In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.
In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 27 June 2024.
Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.
f an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-
(1) Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F(1)19.
(2) Transfer
a. If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
b)

For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height
c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
d)

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show
PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show
GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
OOST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
ETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show
ANY VARIETY NOT SEPARATELY CLASSIFIED For breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled JUNIOR HANDLING Will be judged on handling ability only. Dogs must be entered in another class at this Show IMPORTED BREED REGISTER For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim Breed Standard has been published by the Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class only, with the winning dog being eligible for Best in Group / Best Puppy in Group or BIS / Best Puppy in Show as relevant

You need to have your Car Park pass showing well in advance of entering the show ground so that you can be showed into the correct car park.

## WARNING ALL BLUE BADGE HOLDERS!

There is a Disabled Car Park, however, it is located near the Main Show main ring which is the other side of the show ground. So DO NOT at any time show your Blue Badge unless you want to park in this disabled Car Park, which would mean you would have a long walk. The car park attendants are volunteers, so please do not take it out on them because you are showing them the wrong pass.

## EXHIBITORS PASSES -

Each exhibitor or partnership will receive one pass. This pass allows One person entry into the Show. Any exhibitor or partnership entering three or more dogs will receive an extra pass, (i.e. you enter 3 or more dogs you will only receive 2 passes) this will be strictly adhered to. Therefore if you intend to bring more people, you will need to apply for a passenger pass at the time of entry at a cost of $£ 18.00$ per extra person ( $£ 3.00$ for $5-16$ years old)
Warning; if you don't show the correct passes at the gate, you will be charged $£ \mathbf{2 0 . 0 0}$ (child £4) on the Day! and you will not get a refund. So as soon as you get your passes check that they are correct, any errors can not be changed later.

## DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
